COMMITMENT FOR TITLE INSURANCE

All liability and obligation under this Commitment shall cease and terminate 90 days after the Effective Date or when the policy or policies committed for shall issue, whichever first occurs, provided that the failure to issue the policy or policies is not the fault of the Company.

CONDITIONS

1. The term mortgage, when used herein, shall include deed of trust, trust deed, or other security instrument.
2. If the proposed Insured has or acquired actual knowledge of any defect, lien, encumbrance, adverse claim or other matter affecting the estate or interest or mortgage thereon covered by this Commitment other than those shown in Schedule B hereof, and shall fail to disclose such knowledge to the Company in writing, the Company shall be relieved from liability for any loss or damage resulting from any act of reliance hereon to the extent the Company is prejudiced by failure to so disclose such knowledge. If the proposed Insured shall disclose such knowledge to the Company, or if the Company otherwise acquires actual knowledge of any such defect, lien, encumbrance, adverse claim or other matter, the Company at its option may amend Schedule B of this Commitment accordingly, but such amendment shall not relieve the Company from liability previously incurred pursuant to paragraph 3 of these Conditions and Stipulations.
3. Liability of the Company under this Commitment shall be only to the named proposed Insured and such parties included under the definition of Insured in the form of policy or policies committed for and only for actual loss incurred in reliance hereon in undertaking in good faith (a) to comply with the requirements hereof, or (b) to eliminate exceptions shown in Schedule B, or (c) to acquire or create the estate or interest or mortgage thereon covered by this Commitment. In no event shall such liability exceed the amount stated in Schedule A for the policy or policies committed for and such liability is subject to the insuring provisions and Conditions and Stipulations and the Exclusions from Coverage of the form of policy or policies committed for in favor of the proposed Insured which are hereby incorporated by reference and are made a part of this Commitment except as expressly modified herein.
4. This Commitment is a contract to issue one or more title insurance policies and is not an abstract of title or a report of the condition of title. Any action or actions or rights of action that the proposed Insured may have or may bring against the Company arising out of the status of the title to the estate or interest or the status of the mortgage thereon covered by this Commitment must be based on and are subject to the provisions of this Commitment.
5. The policy to be issued contains an arbitration clause. All arbitrable matters when the Amount of Insurance is \$2,000,000 or less shall be arbitrated at the option of either the Company or the Insured as the exclusive remedy of the parties. REQUIREMENTS

The following requirements must be met:

COMMITMENT FOR TITLE INSURANCE FORM**SCHEDULE B****SECTION TWO****EXCEPTIONS**

Schedule B of the policy or policies to be issued will contain exceptions to the following matters unless the same are disposed of to the satisfaction of the Company:

1. (a) Taxes or assessments that are not shown as existing liens by the records of any taxing authority that levies taxes or assessments on real property or by the Public Records; (b) proceedings by a public agency that may result in taxes or assessments, or notices of such proceedings, whether or not shown by the records of such agency or by the Public Records.
2. Any facts, rights, interests, or claims that are not shown by the Public Records but that could be ascertained by an inspection of the Land or that may be asserted by persons in possession of the Land.
3. Easements, liens or encumbrances, or claims thereof, not shown by the Public Records.
4. Any encroachment, encumbrance, violation, variation, or adverse circumstance affecting the Title that would be disclosed by an accurate and complete land survey of the Land and not shown by the Public Records.
5. (a) Unpatented mining claims; (b) reservations or exceptions in patents or in Acts authorizing the issuance thereof; (c) water rights, claims or title to water, whether or not the matters excepted under (a), (b), or (c) are shown by the Public Records.
6. General taxes and assessments for the year 2007 2nd Installment, 2008 and subsequent years which are not yet due and payable.

7. Right of any interested party by motion, appeal or any other direct proceeding, to have set aside, modified or reversed, within the time allowed by law, the judgment or decree entered in Case 06CH11702 in the Circuit Court of Cook County, Illinois .

Note: the above noted exception will be waived upon the conveyance to a bona fide purchaser.

8. Claim for grass cutting lien in the amount of \$406.25 recorded April 18, 2005 as document 0510845040 by Village of South Holland against subject property.
9. Memorandum of Judgment recorded October 6, 2006 as document 0627957216, in favor of the Village of South Holland and against the subject property, Ticket No. 14966, Circuit Court of Cook County, Illinois, in the amount of \$100.00.
10. Memorandum of Judgment recorded February 27, 2008 as document 0805847078, in favor of the Village of South Holland and against the subject property, Ticket No. 16757, Circuit Court of Cook County, Illinois, in the amount of \$150.00.
11. Claim for grass cutting lien in the amount of \$50.00 recorded February 14, 2008 as document 0804547199 by Village of South Holland against subject property.
12. Note: Our policy when issued will not insure against loss or damage which the insured would sustain by reason of the fact that all charges due to the municipality are not paid to the date of the policy. Such loss or damage includes, but is not limited to, the inability to obtain water and sewer service and municipal revenue stamps was shown as a subparagraph to a mobile home tax lien.
13. The standard exceptions 1 through 6 will be deleted from our policy if the insured land is improved with 1-4 residential units upon review and acceptance of the following:
 - a) an acceptable survey
 - b) a properly executed ALTA 2006 Extended Coverage Statement
 - c) a properly executed Extended Coverage Affidavit.
14. Easements for public utilities, as shown on the plat and contained in the certificate appended to the plat of subdivision.

We Are Committed to Safeguarding Customer Information
